U of M political science regents professor Kathryn Sikkink and her students research human rights regimes, transitional justice, and the role of nongovernmental organizations. Some scholars believe that the threat of prosecution can undermine human rights by entrenching repressive governments and keeping insurgents away from peace talks. Sikkink's research suggests the contrary—that human rights trials actually lead to fewer human rights violations in the long run. So standing up for human rights is always the best thing to do.
